	Discussion of action items and subcommittees Action Item- Approve potential action items and related subcommittees for discussion with Gov. Little	All of these items came from commission members. We will review each item and then prioritize the top five overall. The IBHC in the prevention workgroup is working on parent engagement and education and Youth life-skills. There is a Diversion workgroup could possibly take on the neurocognitive holds.	
		Public Safety: 1- Recommend IBHC take this on. 2- Recommend IBHC take this on. 3- Separate these. There are a lot of issues to cover. 4- Maybe we shouldn't pinpoint one particular elected office. There were suggestions to add emergency communication and cross jurisdictional collaboration.	
		Prevention & Diversion: 1- This is a significant problem. We will not have IBHC review this at this time. Criminal Offense & Conviction: There was discussion about sentencing guidelines. One felt that there aren't any sentencing guideline so what do we really want the group to review? The word "guidelines" draws a certain conclusion. Discussion on process for legislative requests moving forward	After talking to the Governor's office, ICJC will not endorse legislation as a group, unless our subcommittees come up with potential legislation. Other legislation will be pushed out to members to provide feedback or not, but that feedback will not be on behalf of the ICJC membership. Need language that	

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	says a lack of feedback does not state that the agency supports the proposal. Jeff Nye will draft some language for the group to review.	
ICJC MOU and Cost Sharing Options	As part of the work done on the strategic plan, there may be a need for a project manager. Discussions with the Chairman, IAC, and the Governor's office will continue. We could consider the current arrangement. The project manager role could fall upon the chair of the commission. We will need a short term and long-term solution. Each agency may not have the capacity to take on the project manager role and administration. Sara Omundson will speak to the project manager and costs for the IBHC at the next meeting. We need to understand the scope of the work before we will really know if the project manager needs to be part-time or full-time.
