The regular meeting of the Subcommittee to the State Board of Examiners was called to order at 700 W State Street, 4th Floor Syringa Conference Room, Boise, Idaho, at 1:30 p.m. pursuant to Idaho Code §67-2002 and by order of the chair.

<u>Resolution:</u> Ms. Mason moved to place item 3 on the consent agenda. Mr. Snook seconded the motion. The motion carried on a unanimous voice vote.

4. Office of The Attorney General – Action Item – Approved

Request approval to pay the court-awarded attorneys' fees in F.V., et al. v Jeppesen, et al., Case No. 1:17-cv-00170-CWD (D. Idaho), in the amount of \$321,224.50 and refer to the Constitutional Defense Council for payment from the fund created under Idaho code §67-6301. Discussion: Mr. Olsen introduced himself as the chief of civil litigation in the Attorney General's Office. He asked if the Board of Examiners would approve the payment of \$321,224.50 plus accrued interest at the rate of 2.14% from the date of June 8, 2022. Mr. Olsen spoke to the genesis of the court case, stating that it began in 2018 when a lawsuit was brought challenging the state's decision to not change the sex on a person's birth certificate to reflect their gender identity. That same year, the court entered an order stating that the state can no longer automatically reject applications from transgender people to change their sex listed on their birth certificates. The Department of Health and Welfare then complied with the court's injunction. In 2020. House Bill 509 was adopted and shortly after its adoption, the plaintiffs filed a motion to clarify the 2018 permanent injunction. The contention was that the new statute was contrary to the court's injunction, which required the state to not automatically reject applications to change a person's sex identification on their birth certificate. After two motions were filed, the court concluded that the statute did violate the court's permanent injunction. Mr. Olsen reported that it was a hard-fought case, and after that time the plaintiffs submitted a claim for payment of attorneys' fees. The plaintiffs asked the court to enter an award of \$456,478.00 on behalf of the named defendants on this case. Mr. Olsen reported that that amount was rejected, but the court ultimately agreed on a total of \$321,224.50 for attorneys' fees, paralegal costs, and out-of-pocket court fees. Mr. Olsen concluded by asking again if the Board of Examiners would approve this payment and any accrued interest.

Mr. Fulkerson added that the preference of the governor's office is to approve the claim but not to refer it to the Constitutional Defense Council and instead let the legislature work through the budgetary indications of paying the claim.

Mr. Snook stated that he thinks the appropriate motion is reflected in *Mr.* Olsen's letter to the Board of Examiners, which asks that the Board recognize that it is an outstanding debt that needs to be paid pursuant to a court order.

Mr. Benjamin added that changes will be made to the language on the regular meeting agenda to appropriately reflect the request brought forward by Mr. Olsen.

<u>Resolution:</u> Mr. Fulkerson moved to approve payment of the claim and place item 4 on the consent agenda. Mr. Snook seconded the motion. The motion carried on a unanimous voice vote.
