2. Department of Environmental Quality – Action Item

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Benjamin gave a brief overview of the request. No questions were posed.

3. Ada County Clerk – Action Item

Request for reimbursement of costs in the total amount of \$13,099.67 incurred by Ada County to prosecute two State Penitentiary inmates for crimes committed in a correctional facility, pursuant to Idaho Code §18-2507.

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Benjamin gave a brief overview of the request. Mr. Collins asked if the Idaho Department of Corrections has appropriation built in to reimburse the cost. Mr. Benjamin answered that it's like the mileage that is paid out for transporting prisoners. The legislature will put it in the Department of Correction's budget, the claims go to the Board of Examiners to proof, and they send it to the Department of Corrections to pay.
