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10.	IDJC Update	<ul> <li>Updates from IDJC: The IJOS system that is currently used around the State of Idaho is getting a facelift: IJOS 2.0. This will be a cloud-based system and release is rumored to be in late summer. This new system will allow access to Probation Officers while they are working in the field.</li> <li>With new software will come a password protected portal on the main website. Lots of information will be made available and should be launched very soon.</li> <li>Assessment Centers: There were sixty-one (61) youth referred. A marketing video is still being worked on in order to get the word out. With a few edits left and director approval, everyone will soon be able to see the Assessment Center Marketing Video. Once completed it will be available on the website.</li> <li>COPS division has filled three positions on the prevention side of things. The leadership team is filled with some open positions in the unit. POST Academy Coordinator Position will be opening soon.</li> <li>Ms. Haro inquired as to distribution of the marketing video of the assessment centers.</li> <li>Ms. Baptiste advised that the video will be available for everyone in the State of Idaho. The goal is to share the video with not just juveniles but with the families. There are two (2) assessment centers open, one in Jerome and one in Twin. District 4 and Bannock County are close to opening their assessment centers.</li> </ul>	District Liaison

It was noted that some counties have unknowns in IJOS, concerns about duplicate information and discussions on connecting communities.</li> <li>Alicia Baptiste: A meeting was held to look at the disparity in Ada County and discuss making a commission to looks at said disparities. The goal is to have all groups do the same thing and work together. Some disparities come from data sharing and different systems being used by different counties. Further, discussion about wanting Law Enforcement Officers to be consistent as well. A meeting will commence in two weeks to discuss ideas.</li> <li>Deinstitutionalization of Status Offenders: Robin Coley advised that DeeDee was on vacation.</li> </ul>	All subcommittee members

		Robin Coley advised the Pubic Defender's Office was still hiring.		
		Deonda Thompson noted that sometime around March a resource center will open either at		
		the existing building on Denton or Benjamin. Ada County hired three (3) family		
		engagement specialists that will do assessments on families that potentially come to the		
		center. Those people are still training and we hoping to open soon in one of those locations.		
		Hillary Haro shared a power point in regard to collaborative health care and Medicare		
		expansion. This plan is the biggest in Idaho for a 72-million-dollar inpatient and mental		
		health treatment. It has not gone to the legislature yet. The goal is to promote recovery and		
		resilience for Idahoans and not to have out of home placement.		
		We need to analyze outcomes and obtain evidence in order to standardize care across the		
		State. There will be five (5) bureaus with State oversight and we had started hiring.		
		Ultimate goal is to privatize at some point. Lots of policy and big picture work left, as		
		negotiations are still occurring. No dates yet, still lots of planning.		
		Amanda Leader: Advised the plan to have three (3) schools districts meet and share a		
		social working position but only two (2) of the schools have money. Hoping to see this		
		happen next year. Did a facilitator training and the first meeting only five (5) girls show up.		
		No one showed up for the second meeting. Magistrate Judge position should be filled by		
		April. Boise County started e-tickets. This might put a stop to diversion program.		
		Bought five (5) drug testing kits.		
		Sam Moore: advised a meeting was held in regard to the annual conference. The		
		workshops have been selected. Please register if interested. Continues to work with youth		

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		committee and discussions are being held on how to teach youth to be adults as well as learn basic tasks.
