

6.	IDJC Liaison Update	<p>Jeff Miller will now be the main support for the District 5 Juvenile Justice Council. All Office Specialist 2 and Administrative Assistant 1 personnel from Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections have been relieved of support duties.</p> <p>The 2025 Law Enforcement Evaluation process is underway. Just finished 17 evaluations with a new agency in Hagerman (Gooding County) had been added. All agencies are currently compliant with the four core requirements.</p> <p>Government is in a shutdown at this time which does affect the Title II Grant, all reimbursements submitted by September 30th should be processed. However, no additional funds can be spent at this time.</p>	Jeff Miller

8.	3 Year Planning <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Update plan dates • Make assignments 	<p>Discussed the process of how to distribute out the 15 Court Solutions courses and 10 3rd Millennium for Truancy courses. Tiffany reported on the 1,500 for 3rd Millennium and court solutions courses that were approved. There is a code/scan code that can be used to use classes. Council discussed how to disperse the classes. Brittany said she can do a form to keep track of who uses the classes and what classes. Will email all the chiefs of probation that the classes are available and how to access. The classes will be first come first serve. 15 for court solutions and 10 for 3rd millennium. The email will go out to all chiefs. Tiffany will send info to Brittany to send to chiefs. Brittany will then contact all chief probation officers with the info, will send them codes as they request and keep track of it. Wade suggested tracking info on youth taking courses, ie. Diversion or previous justice involved youth.</p>	All members

Members Reports/Discussion	<p>Patrick Galloway, civil cases for Gooding and Lincoln County attended Idaho Juvenile Justice Association conference: Gained a better understanding of the system to perform his job more effectively. Highlighted the value of restorative justice- giving youth opportunities to engage meaningfully with victims. Stressed the importance of mentorship for youth exposed to radical ideologies. Emphasized the need for youth to form healthy, trusting relationships with adults, which takes time and patience. Found sessions on vaping and personal security interventions to be particularly valuable.</p> <p>Trent Kobayashi, diversion officer for Twin Falls attended Idaho Juvenile Justice Association conference: Felt the restorative conferencing sessions</p>	All Members

		<p>reinforced the mission of juvenile services. One event discussed mediation with victims as an essential part of diversion work.</p> <p>Carles Kelly Executive Director of Twin Falls Optimist Youth House; Represents a community-run nonprofit providing transitional housing and life-skills support for youth aged 18–23. Services: Independent living skills (e.g., banking, cooking, car maintenance). Support with education (high school, GED, college, or trade). Help with employment: resume writing, job searching, and obtaining documentation. Important Notes: Not a counseling facility – referrals made for counseling, med management, and drug treatment. Low-supervision program – does <i>not</i> accept violent or sexual offenders. Capacity: 14 residents (7 boys, 7 girls); operating at full capacity for the past 7 years, with a waitlist at times. Length of stay: No minimum; maximum is 2 years. Curfew only applies in cases of behavioral issues or Probation requirements; residents must notify staff if staying out overnight. Application process: Should begin at least 3 months before turning 18. Currently: 2 openings for boys, 1 for girls. Application is available online. Program Fee Structure (incentivized to encourage full participation): \$300/month base fee. Deductions: \$100 off if in school. \$100 off if employed. \$100 off if attending two required classes. If all conditions are met, the program is free.</p> <p>Korey Solomon, Northstar attended Idaho Juvenile Justice Association conference: Shared insights from sessions on Alcohol and drug trends among youth. Artificial Intelligence (AI) developments, and importance of cybersecurity awareness.</p> <p>Brittany, Recently visited the Capital. Shared updates on the 2024 request for the office to perform oversight of children’s residential care programs. Gave a recap of key findings and next steps regarding oversight responsibilities. All agencies need to be on the same page in Idaho so all youth get the same protections.</p>
