Placements will be scrutinized moving forward. Only the juveniles who truly require placement at MANA will be placed there.</li> <li>• Emily Gleason: Petitions have slowed down. Heritage Health no longer providing services. Seeking alternative providers. Treatment Counselors are opening up independent offices.</li> <li>• Robin Bessey: Currently 9 juveniles in Detention. Things are going well in Detention.</li> <li>• Dustin Cook: Still looking to hire for a PCPA position. Otherwise, things are going well.</li> <li>• Greg Lee: Canopy Village is busy. Every single bed is currently being utilized. Greg is going to reach out to stakeholders for a March 24<sup>th</sup> meeting. Canopy Village is seeking feedback from stakeholders about needs in their communities.</li> <li>• Bryan Alexander: Caseloads are steady with 195 juveniles currently on Probation. Loss of Absolute Testing (no longer accepting BPA funds). Exploring Redwood call in drug testing model. Kootenai County Juvenile Probation is exploring applying supervision fees to juveniles on Probation.</li> <li>• Ron Stultz: Two open Juvenile Probation Officer positions (one male required). 7 juveniles currently in Detention, 5 of them are females. Detention is fully staffed pending a March hire.</li> </ul>
