The next regional meeting will be Thursday, April 16th.</p> <p>South-Central Region – Fran Jamison Fran Jamison shared the next regional meeting will be Wednesday, March 11th.</p> <p>Southeast Region – Greg Vickers Greg Vickers shared the Regional Chair has resigned from their position, so the committee will hold elections at their next regional meeting.</p> <p>East Region – Eric Day Eric Day shared the next regional meeting will be Thursday, March 19th.</p>
<p>TSE Branch Update</p>	<p>Melissa Ball shared 34 out of 45 facilities that have been approved which makes up 76 percent of Idaho facilities who hold one or more TSE designation, and five EMS agencies have been TSE EMS designated. The TSE Branch and EMS Bureau are collaborating to make data visualization easier in Biospatial and TSE EMS Designation Performance Goals cards were created for EMS agencies to remind which data metrics to achieve in order to become TSE EMS designated. The TSE Branch is working towards declaring Idaho as a Stroke Smart state during Stroke Awareness Month in May.</p> <p>Lastly, the governor-appointed positions in Idaho Statute 46-916 2c, 2d, 2f and 2h, will open to candidates to apply from April 1st and 30th, and interviews and voting will take place on Tuesday, May 12th, at the May TSE Council Meeting.</p>
<p>EMSC Program Update</p>	<p>Stacy Rodgers shared that the program has been promoting the Prehospital Readiness Recognition Program and received high interest from EMS agencies who would like to apply. The in-person EMSC Advisory Committee meeting will be Thursday, April 9th at the St. Luke’s Health Plaza in Boise.</p> <p>EMSC and Simulation in Motion Montana (SIM-MT) have partnered to provide four mobile simulation trainings for EMS and hospital providers in Coeur d’Alene, Orofino, and Weiser. The program will be receiving 500 Broselow Tapes in June to be distributed to hospital EDs and EMS agencies. Lastly, the National Pediatric Readiness Project (NPRP) has opened a 90-day survey to hospital EDs to determine how pediatric ready they are.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2.2.1 – Added new language regarding Council members may reapply and new candidates can apply for a governor-appointed position once a member has served one full term.• 2.4 – Removed language regarding how the Council’s recommended nomination no longer needs the approval of the Board of Health and Welfare.• 3.4.1 – Revised language regarding the Vice-Chair’s election year and term length.• 3.7 – Removed language regarding Parliamentarian.• 4.8 – Revised language regarding the Order of Business agenda items.• 7.3 – Revised language regarding the process to make motions on TSE designations once out of Executive Session.
