The POST Council Hearing Board may convene into executive session on agenda items pursuant to Idaho Code 74-106(1), "To consider records that are exempt from disclosure – Personnel Records, Personal Information, Health Records, Professional Discipline."

The POST Council Hearing Board may convene into executive session on agenda items pursuant to Idaho Code 74-206(1)(b), "To consider the evaluation, dismissal or disciplining of, or to hear complaints or charges brought against, a public officer, employee, staff member or individual agent, or public-school student;"

The POST Council Hearing Board may convene into executive session on agenda items pursuant to Idaho Code 74-206 (f) to communicate with legal counsel for the public agency to discuss the legal ramifications of and legal options for pending litigation, or controversies not yet being litigated but imminently likely to be litigated. The mere presence of legal counsel at an executive session does not satisfy this requirement.
