1.	Call to Order and Introductions	Korey called to order at 9:03am	Korey Solomon
2.	ACTION ITEM: Approval of Meeting Minutes for May 14, 2026 and June 25, 2026	Correction needed on Tiffany's last name. Tiffany Henderson made a motion to approved May 14 th minutes, Dixie Tate made a second. Council approved May 14 th minutes. June 25 th meeting minutes- Carol Johnson made a motion to approve June 25 th meeting minutes. Brittany Shipley made a second and the council approved the minutes of June 25 th 2026.	All Members
3.	ACTION ITEMS: Korey Solomon's continuation as D5 JJ Council Chair. Funding Requests:	Council members expressed their approval of Korey being the council chair. All members stated that they do not wish to have a new chair but would prefer to have Korey as the council chair. Carol Johnson made a motion to keep Korey Solomon as council chair. Dixie Tate made a second. The council then voted and approved Korey to be reappointed as the District 5 Juvenile Justice Council Chair.	All Members

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Court Solutions class purchases by council. Altis Counseling/Shelly Osborne: Request for funds for treatment manuals; 50 manuals at 35 each. \$1,750.00 IJJA Scholarships- Officer Dave Gomez (Tall Cop Organization) training. Council to fund part or full day up to \$9,500.	Council members discussed funding request from Altis Counseling for treatment manuals they use for youth that are not funded by any other source. The cost of these manuals is put on the youth and their families and Altis would like to alleviate this. There was discussion on if this would be used for only D5 youth. Council members discussed that if approved, the funds should only be used for District 5 Youth. Dixie Tate made a motion to approve the \$1750.00 for 35 treatment manuals for Altis Counseling to only be used for youth in District 5. Carol Johnson made a second to approve. The council then voted and approved the funding request for Altis Counseling. There was discussion on court solutions. Carol said classes are 50.00 per class. Carol said they have 9 3rd millennium classes from the last expenditure. Carol recommends only buying Court Solutions. Carol said 30 classes at 58 per class would be \$1,750. 100 classes would be 1,500 due to discount. Carol and Dixie said their counties will definitely use the funds. Schools can also use them. Jennifer said the schools may use it for Truancy if they were told about it. Tiffany said in Twin Falls the diversion coordinator does go around and talk to all vice principals on use for truancy courses. Carol said she thinks they can get these out to the schools more this time. Brittany said she could help get info on the classes to schools in Blaine County. Dixie Tate made a motion to buy 100 court solutions online courses for a total of \$5,000. Allyson Christiansen made a 2nd and the council approved. Approved to spend \$5,000 on Court Solutions classes. Korey Solomon will pay for the classes up front and ask for reimbursement. Members discussed funding scholarships for IJJA. Dixie Tate made a motion to approve up to 8 scholarships to IJJA at 500 a piece. Tiffany Henderson made a 2nd. It was approved by the council for up to \$4,000. Total for 8 scholarships to IJJA that will take place Sept. 15-16.

Administrators/Chief JPOs will be informed of the scholarships and will be instructed to pass the funding request form on to their staff. Applicants will submit funding requests through the funding form link. Only the first 8 submissions will be approved. Council tabled Officer Gomez funding at this time.

Jeff has started D5 Law Enforcement site visits that are due this year for OJJDP core protections compliance. Will complete 16 over the next 2.5 months. New Behavioral Health Specialist working with SUDS funding- Darby Fulwieder; She started July 13th. New Hire for the Post/Interstate Compact Manager Position- Audrey Mckay; She will start Aug 3rd. JJ Commission Family Engagement Sub-Committee had their June online Speaker Series presentation. Celia Walters with Simply Hope spoke on Engaging families in Case Management. She is hopeful that detention center clinicians can look at the positive aspects in a youths life and not just the Adverse/ACES scale. Jesse Lawson from IPUL (Idaho Parents Unlimited) talked about Idaho Parents Unlimited. They are a non-profit that helps families get help and resources for youth. They also help with medical, education and 504s. They do not offer legal assistance. IPUL now has the contract to run the YES program.	All Members
