10.	Tribal Updates	<p>Coeur d'Alene:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quiet with the juveniles. Number of booked juveniles per month is going down. • Adult number are still high, especially with use of Fentanyl. • CAST employees are advocates for the youth over 12 years old who come from a MYNOC case. <p>Kootenai:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Few cases overall, which are civil cases. • Treatment is the first course of action over sentencing. • Exclusion is one way to deter drug use. • The two police officers are trained to deescalate the situation and work with people rather than booking them. <p>Nez Perce:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New juvenile probation officer. • New grants- Students for Success and are looking to hire another counselor. • Pending juvenile case-for a shooting threat. • The Tribal Council should discuss the impact that Social Media has on the youth on the reservations.
