- i. Ed Jacobson notes that FBI has MOUs with the Coeur d'Alene tribe and Kootenai tribe related to the child abuse MDTs, which may serve as a better example than Billy's MOUs, as they are related to law enforcement services. Ed will look for these and share if available.
- b. Tribal feedback?
 - i. Billy Barquin notes that the Boundary County Sheriff's Office MOU is more of a contract for law enforcement services and cross deputization. The Kootenai has MOUs with Probation & Parole and Border Patrol, and will continue to look for these and share with the Subcommittee when available.
