WELCOME/INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Lewis welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 9:41 am MST. Roll call attendance was taken, and a quorum was established.

MEETING MINUTES

MOTION: Mr. Weber moved, and Ms. Robertson seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the January 12, 2023, meeting; the motion passed unanimously.

IGC-EC ELECTION RESULTS

Ms. Lewis provided a summary of the bi-annual election results. Newly elected members include: Cyndi Andersen, City of Meridian (Local), Wendy Largent, Northern Lights (Utility) and Jackie Reader, GIS Consultant (Open). The terms are effective April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2025. Chair Lewis also expressed gratitude to Mr. Lim for his years of service.

BOUNDARY TWG STANDARD AND NOMINATION

MOTION: Ms. Robertson moved, and Ms. Andersen seconded, the motion to approve the standard \$4235 Idaho Legislative and Congressional Districts; the motion was approved.

MOTION: Ms. Robertson moved, and Ms. Green seconded, the motion to approve the Idaho Legislative and Congressional Districts nomination; the motion was approved.

IMAGERY TWG STANDARD AND NOMINATION

MOTION: Ms. Robertson moved, and Mr. Godfrey seconded, the motion to approve the standard S4246 Recent and Historical Imagery; the motion was approved.

MOTION: Ms. Green moved, and Ms. Andersen seconded, the motion to approve the Recent and Historical Imagery nomination; the motion was approved.

GIO OFFICE - UPDATES

Ms. Robertson provided the highlights of the NSGIC Midyear meeting. A major take away was the National Governance objectives of elevating public-private engagement, maintaining equity at the table beyond Federal involvement, and a comprehensive national communication program. Also, a goal of July 2024 for the final version of the National Spatial Data Infrastructure (NSDI) Strategic Plan.

General topics included: Building footprint layer will become more important over time; Public safety may start requiring internal building plans; Flood management for susceptible ground floor; NSGIC wrote a COVID19 / Pandemic Playbook. Does your organization have a vendor in place in case you need to task satellite in an emergency? GIS is the data supply chain that feeds Google.

Arizona, Indiana and Texas have successful volunteer programs that can provide valuable strategies.

Additionally, Ms. Robertson gave an update on the status of the NG9-1-1 project stating that data collection and preparation is complete for all counties and heading for onboarding into the DataMark SaaS.

The FCC Broadband challenge provides an opportunity to identify the unserved and underserved communities, thereby helping to determine Idaho's Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) program funding.

TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP UPDATES

Elevation TWG

Mr. Keith Weber spoke on behalf of Mr. Enterkine and stated that for Lidar data 40% of the state is covered. Most of the data is available for download. The TWG is offering a Lidar workshop in April that is free to participants due to FEMA funding.

The TWG meets the first Thursday of every month at 1p.m. MT.

Boundary TWG

Ms. Robertson stated that the current focus of the TWG is coordinating the county boundaries and it is ongoing.

The TWG meets the third Thursday of every month at 2p.m. MT.

Imagery TWG

Ms. Margie Wilkins highlighted a presentation given by Bruce Godfrey of the Univ of Idaho – Inside Idaho, covering ArcGIS Image for ArcGIS online. The presentation is available online.

The meetings are scheduled for the first Wednesday of the month at 10:00 am MT.

Cadastral TWG

Ms. Dunn informed the attendees of an upcoming meeting with ESRI for input on consolidating the parcel fabric data.

The next meeting is Tuesday March 28th at 3p.m. MT.

Geodetic TWG

Mr. Beckstead was unavailable to attend and will be stepping down as Chair of the TWG.

The TWG meets the fourth Thursday of every month.

Transportation TWG

Ms. Lewis stated that work continues to move forward on the standards for the airports and bridges datasets. Also, the TWG has been coordinating with the team working on the NG9-1-1 project.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Weber reminded everyone that the 2023 TekTalks are rolling out and the first was taking place later that same day.

Ms. Reader noted that with her departure the position at City of Chubbock would be available for those interested.

Mr. Folsom advised that broader dissemination of the information, data and tools available through the Idaho Geospatial Office would be beneficial.
