

1.	Call to Order & Announcements	12:03 PM Dahlia called the meeting to order. Introductions.	Dahlia Stender	
2.	Action Item: Approval of Meeting Minutes 4.04.24 & 5.09.24	Linda motioned to approve. Harold seconded. No discussion. None opposed. Motion passed.	All Members	
3.	Guest Item: Taro Golden & Whitney Sanchez with Crossroads Mentoring	Taro Golden & Whitney Sanchez presented what Crossroads Mentoring's goal is in the community and how their program is structured to help youth. Harold asked how they get their referrals. Taro advised they can receive them from anyone. Whitney advised the funding is from CBASS. Harold also asked about alternative schools and will they be visiting those as well. Taro responded they would be visiting alternative schools as well. Savannah asked if there was a set age range to receive services from Crossroads Mentoring. Whitney advised all ages are able to receive services, and it will be a case by case basis. Savannah stated that youth mentoring is difficult right now in Canyon County especially for high schoolers because of scheduling conflicts. Whitney stated that she has colleagues who live in Canyon County and may possibly be available to hopefully assist in outlying areas. Linda asked if anyone can call and staff a mentoring service with them, they said yes to call.		
4.	Training Fund Recipient Updates: Sydney Brown, Kalyssa Kempthorn, and Maclain Stultz, Angie Martinez	Sydney's feedback was NAC 2023 had more information pertaining to JPO's than ICADD this year. There were only a couple of sessions in ICADD that they could take information from. ICADD more focused more towards the clinical side. Maclain seconded what Sydney stated. ICADD was geared more towards service focused vs. probation and trending issues in the community. Maclain stated the fentanyl session and learned a lot. He said it resembled Post training.		

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		<p>Kalyssa stated she hasn't done Post yet, but did like the fentanyl training a lot. She advised the neurobiology was very interesting to her and how drugs effect mental health.</p> <p>Angie stated that ICADD conferences in past years there was more to take away, but still informative and wouldn't discourage people attending it. She also stated JPO's received more of a window into the providers side of drug addiction.</p>

6.	General Business Items: Advertising for RJ Facilitator training discussion.	Harold presented his diagram and his ideas for advertising and implementing Restorative Justice in schools. He would like to make sure this aligns with Idaho's laws and structure in the justice systems. Dahlia advised she would like to plan on how Harold will go out into the communities to implement the training. Harold would like to know if council is ok with him putting in the District 3 monthly letter that he can offer RJ training. Dahlia advised to have a plan before advertising. She stated books need to be ordered, dates for training need to be decided, and see what districts are interested. She also stated it will need to be decided if RJ training will be open to probation and IDJC. Dahlia suggested Harold to make a proposal and present it to the council.	All Members

The chair meeting also covered funding and by laws, 3 yr. plans, and reimbursement issues. Discussed new IDJC director Ashley Dowell. 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	<p>how funding will be allocated once he presents it. Dahlia presented that she would like to see an opportunity for training on mentoring. IJJA is coming up in September, and taking place in Idaho Falls, ID. Individuals wanting to attend can still receive council funding for it. October funding will be for 2024-2026 Three Year Plan. Linda has concerns that everyone has a different idea of what mentoring means and may be hard to do mentor training. She suggested we bring another trainer in to for the district like Kevin Powell last year, to allow more people to receive training, rather than paying for individuals to attend separate trainings. Tara advised she may have funding available to support training for mentor/individuals who work with youth prevention training. Dahlia will look into Aces training, and ensure the resiliency portion of the training will be able to actionably be put into effect in the community.</p>		
9.	<p>Roundtable Reports</p> <p>Harold – Working on RJ Training.</p> <p>Linda – Several new staff and doing lots of training. New supervisor starting July 8th along with other staff.</p> <p>Tara – Sub grantees throughout the region to do prevention work throughout the region. Currently working with the Marsing. Will open minigrant opportunity over the summer and she will advise when that will launch.</p> <p>Whitney – Nothing has changed since previous meeting attended.</p> <p>Shannon – She has larger caseloads currently. She stated more than they have seen ever. Gem County is currently working on a proposal for a true diversion to be implemented.</p> <p>Oster – New changes to CWI. There is a new health science center being built, a 40-acre farm, and a new campus in Boise. New mascot coming to CWI in the fall, will be the Otters. Summer bridge program is currently taking place. It is a two-track program. One track is automotive, diesel mechanics, welding, machining. Second track is computer science, cyber security etc. Explained bridge program.
